### **OUR CHURCH LABYRINTH**

Faith and spirituality come to us as a journey from the outer beginning toward the inner finishing, perfecting and fulfilling — and Jesus Christ is the Way. Saint Paul the Apostle of Christ declared the following message of Christian faith: "Let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and finisher of our faith" (from Hebrews 12:1-2). Also, Saint John the Apostle of Christ revealed the following message of hope from Jesus our Savior and Lord: "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End" (from John 22:13).



Consequently, early Christians adopted and adapted the pre-Christian symbol of the labyrinth as a very useful illustration of the Christian journey of faith, hope and love in Christ Jesus. In fact, labyrinths have been around for approximately 4000 years. For example, the brain-like shape to the left of this paragraph is a crude ancient form of labyrinth.

Basically, a labyrinth is a spiritual design with a path that eventually leads us to the center. So as a tool for prayerful mediation, the labyrinth first moves the walker only near the center before it finally leads to the true center. Another example is to the right of this paragraph, and it is the design of a Medieval Christian labyrinth from Chartes Cathedral in France.

For Christians the *True Center* of our faith and spiritual life is Jesus. By God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ we are reconciled to God, and by his Holy Spirit we are guided in the faith, hope and love of Christ. As Jesus himself said, "The Helper, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you" (from John 14:26-27).

The labyrinth, therefore, is not a maze or a puzzle. It is simply a geometric path used in prayerful mediation to connect us more deeply with the True Center of all life and existence, the infinite and eternal God of all.

To that end, the path of our church labyrinth at Adoration begins with a stone at the starting point, reminding us of Jesus Christ, the great Cornerstone of God's Kingdom. For through Jesus' life, crucifixion, death, and resurrection, he has fulfilled the poetic prophecy of Psalm 118:22-23, which states, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. This is the Lord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes." (The center bench is also made of stone.)

Our hexagonal church labyrinth was designed and constructed by Nicholas A. Singleton for his Eagle Scout project. He was assisted by the Scouts of Adoration's Boy Scout Troop 501.





Lastly, the following are guidelines for prayerfully walking our church labyrinth:

### + JOURNEY TOWARD THE CENTER +

# As you enter the labyrinth, you begin the first of three stages of your prayer walk:

### Stage I — Purgation

This is a time for releasing, letting go, relaxing, centering and focusing.

### + AT THE CENTER +

As you reach the center, you are open to the second stage of your prayer walk:

### Stage II — Illumination

Stay in the center for as long as you like, because it is a place of deep quiet and prayerful meditation. The time at the center is for clarity, insight, and the Holy Spirit's guidance, so openly receive from God whatever is there for you.

### + JOURNEY FROM THE CENTER +

As you travel the path outward from the center, you are walking the third stage:

### Stage III — Union

In deeper communion with the Holy Spirit of God, you bring back with you a refreshed spirit. And you may also experience a renewal of purpose, vision and mission in life.

May this church labyrinth at Adoration be a tool for you to find restful stillness, a deeper connection with God, and the inner joy and peace that Christ promises to give us by the power of the Holy Spirit.



### ~ The Twelve Days of Christmas ~

From 1558 to 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. This popular carol was written as a catechism song. It has two levels of meaning, a surface one and one known only to members of the Church. Each element in the carol was a code for a religious reality, which all ages could remember. Of course, the meaning of these words can be affirmed by all Christians, including both Catholics and Protestants.

- 1. **The partridge in the pear tree** is Jesus Christ.
- 2. Two turtledoves are the Old and New Testaments.
- 3. Three French hens stand for faith, hope and love.
- 4. **The four calling birds** are the Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
- 5. The five golden rings recall the Torah, the first five books of the Bible.
- 6. **The six geese a-laying** stand for the six days of creation.
- 7. **Seven swans a-swimming** represent the seven fold gifts of the Holy Spirit: prophecy, serving, teaching, exhortation, contribution, leadership and mercy.
- 8. **The eight maids a-milking** are the Beatitudes of Jesus.
- 9. **Nine ladies dancing** are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.
- 10. **The ten Lords a-leaping** are the Ten Commandments.
- 11. **The eleven pipers piping** stand for the eleven faithful disciples.
- 12. The twelve drummers drumming symbolize the twelve points of belief within the Apostles' Creed.

We are looking for members who would like to be part of our Prayer Chain. What is a prayer chain? A prayer chain is a network of people who pass a prayer request on to others and pray for each request. How does it work? Every prayer chain members has a list of the other members and their phone numbers. The pray chain coordinator, Judy Goodwin, calls the first person on the list. That person does three things; (1) They contact the next person available on the list. (2) They convey the
