All good things are happening at Adoration. After working hard for ten months, the MET finished its process with the presentation of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) at the Town Hall meeting on February 2. The Council took their final vote on February 11, 2020 and the MSP is now officially in to the Synod! Yeah, Adoration!! So proud of y'all.

So, what's next?

The Call Committee now begins to read, learn and inwardly digest the MSP. That document is their working "Bible" for the rest of the process. It will drive their questions to the candidates and their decisions and discernment around "fit" for your new Pastor. It is YOUR document of what you believe you need and want in a new Pastor. They now need time to make sure they own that document as much as the MET does. Once they do then they will:

- *Plan for what kinds of questions it want to ask the candidates.
- *Hold a mock interview with a local Pastor and get feedback on their questions.
- *Interview candidates.
- *Do a formal background check.
- *Discern the best fit candidate.
- *Forward choice to Council.
- *Hold "meet and greet" with chosen candidate.
- *Hold Call meeting with congregation.
- *Celebrate your new Pastor!

Dear two legged friends,

My Mom who normally writes for this newsletter has been sick this month, so I volunteered to write for her. I hope that's okay.

Many people ask about me. I suppose that's because my Pastor-Mom has my picture all over

her office! So, what about me? Well, I sleep a lot. I continue to age. It's been a long, hard winter for me. I am from Alabama and this snow and ice stuff is killin' me! In human years I'd be in my sixties now. I clearly feel my age. But I am still loved. And even though I don't have all my teeth anymore, I can still eat. I'm beginning to get cataracts, but my Moms keep the furniture in the same place so I will be able to make my way around by memory and smell.

I can still walk, although I am not quite as steady on my legs anymore and I can't walk as far. But sometimes, especially when it's REALLY cold outside, my Moms just carry me to a place outside with nice smells (and where they think I will do what dogs are supposed to do outside). They support me with their hands after they put me down until I sort out my legs and figure out which one goes where first. Sometimes I slip, but they always pick me up and gently put me back up on my feet, holding me again, until I am surer of my footing. I know that I am loved. I trust my Moms to take good care of me, and they do.

My Moms tell me that God is like that with us, too. He helps us to navigate when in our blindness we would hurt ourselves without His help. He sometimes simply carries us and takes us to the places we need to go, hoping we will then do the rest and do what we are called to do. And, God ever so gently supports us when we have our legs swept out from under us and need His support until we get back up on our feet.

I hope that I get to meet God someday. I hope you do, too. (P.S. I wonder if you have ever noticed that God is Dog spelled backwards?) Woof! Kirk

Church Council Highlights

Here are some of the items discussed at the FEBRUARY Church Council meeting:

- Tom Nowakowski and Ted Lazaris met with a representative from a cleaning franchise company "Coverall". After the meeting the company was interested in doing the cleaning service for Adoration. Their contract will start with Adoration on February 22, 2020. The new cleaning service will save us approximately \$90 a month.
- ♦ Jim Haas is looking for help with posting information on the church sign. We are also looking for a group or committee that would be willing to handle the Facebook account for Adoration.
- Social Ministry would like to have a tool drive June 21, 2020 for Habitat for Humanity. They are looking for members to bring garden tools, hand tools, gently used tools or monetary donations. Goal is to collect \$1,000 to go toward Habitat for Humanity. All the above donations would be counted toward the \$1,000 donation. Tom Nowakowski moved to allow Social Ministry to have a tool drive June 21, 2020 for Habitat for Humanity. Sean McGinty seconded the motion, motion carried.
- Social Ministry would like to have Prayer shawls available at Adoration for anyone in need. Shawls can be used for anyone as comfort after a loss, times of stress, undergoing surgery, prayer, meditation etc. They can be given to anyone you feel needs comfort or just a hug. They are looking for any members willing to crochet, knit or sew prayer shawls. They will be out in the opening for anyone to take for that special person in need. Sandy Eigner moved to have Prayer shawls as part of our ministry. Sean McGinty seconded the motion, motion carried.
- Pastor John Jacob contacted Pastor Debra regarding a tour in United States by Yousef Natshah. Yousef is involved with a Christian Peace Maker Group. He is showing a thirty-minute film- Life in Occupied Palestine. Pastor John was asking if Adoration can be a venue for them to show the film followed by a Q/A period. After discussion, Sandy Eigner moved that Adoration host the thirty-minute documentary with a Q/A period. Hebron-Chronicles life in occupied Palestine. March 19, 2020. Jim Haas seconded the motion, motion carried.
- ◆ The Mission Site Profile has an expectation that we update the church directory with accurate phone numbers, addresses and email accounts before the new Pastor arrives. We also need to wear nametags with designations for people in leadership, to help the new Pastor to get to know us.
- ♦ All committees are reminded to write their events throughout the year on the calendar in the church office. This way we will know what days are available and events that are already scheduled.

The Season of Lent

What should I "give up" for Lent?

People often ask "what should I 'give up" for Lent?" The idea is that we do some things that are sacrificial during Lent. So, here are some ideas culled from different places on the 2020 internet:

- Give time to bless others—Send some handwritten notes of encouragement—make the time to do it regularly during Lent. Put a sticky note of appreciation each day in someone's life so that they can see it. Do someone else's chore for them. Send an encouraging email a day to someone.
- + Do a "day of saving"—keep track of what you don't buy for yourself. At the end of Lent, total up the cost and give it to a local charity or Adoration.
- Read some spiritual book during Lent that you might not have touched. Ask your Pastor if you have no ideas.
- + Limit your technology—adopt a "no scroll" policy. Limit your FB usage. Limit your game apps on your smart phone, etc. etc.
- + Give up habits that weigh you down: Think of the day's blessings before you go to sleep. (Bless not obsess). Take a day of rest. Limit your swearing. Limit comparing yourself to others.
- Consider food—Trade coffee for water, or a snack for a prayer for those who are hungry. Consider fasting from alcohol for Lent. Consider fasting from sweets. Buy two, give one (when you shop). Plan more, waste less. (So much of our food is wasted.)
- Pray. Set aside even ten minutes a day to spend time with God. The church is in Year A—that's the year of the Gospel of Matthew. There are 28 chapters in Matthew. Read a chapter a day and take a day off on Sundays.

Y'all may have other good ideas. Sacrifice during Lent is about being intentional and staying committed. Use these ideas to approach the season in a new way, re-energize your relationship with God, and experience lasting change that positively impacts you — and others — during Lent, and beyond.

Outreach for Hope - 2020 Lenten Devotions



Meru & Mulala ~ Our Partners in Ministry

2019 was a special year for me and for our partnership as it was our 20th anniversary of our commitment to one another. I was there is 1999 when this covenant partnership was begun and it was the first parish to parish partnership, although our Synod had already established a partnership with the Diocese of Meru. This was my 7th trip to Tanzania and it has been such a great blessing to my life. We have given Meru and Mulala gifts of money but most of all we have given them hope that we were standing with them. When you give gifts to the people of Meru, they respond with, "we have nothing to give you but our prayers." To me that is the greatest gift of all. Our partnership is based on prayer for one another.

I am so pleased and proud of Adoration as over the years I have seen our gifts to them help so very much. More children are able to go to school. Pastors and teachers are being paid. The coffee project has given the small farmers a better living as we pay them a fair price for their coffee. More pastors have been ordained as we helped send them to seminary. On the Synod level, greater projects are being done such as developing water sources. To see the smiles of children as we give them toothbrushes and candy. To see the love on the faces of the people as we join them in prayers before a meal. To attend worship services and see the church overflowing with people. To hear their amazing choirs, who have no sheet music or instruments. To see about 50 children in Mulala's Sunday school. Also to mention the amazing landscape, free roaming animals and the beauty of Mt. Kilimanjaro and know that this is all God's creation. Although our lives are so different than theirs, we are one in our faith.

In Tanzania, the government does nothing for the people, so please let us continue to love, support and pray for our brothers and sisters there and keep this partnership alive.
