Dear lovely Adoration members:

This is an all-congregation update on things that matter about God's church on 38th and Edgerton:

1. Curbside Communion: We are having a Curbside Communion this coming Sunday, August 2, 2020 from 9AM to 10AM. Please read the following directions for coming to Adoration that day to receive the sacrament from your car. You should already have received these in a separate email:

Guidance for Drive-through Holy Communion

From 9 a.m. to 10 a.m. on August 2, 2020, you are welcome to come to Adoration to receive Holy Communion from Pastor Debra while remaining in your car in the parking lot. This will last until we are finished distributing Holy Communion to those who come—or 10 a.m. if there is no one left to receive. We are also asking, if you wish to, that you also bring a pair or package of socks for homeless individuals in the greater Milwaukee community. God's work, our hands.

We also ask that you follow these guidelines:

- Please come in a vehicle. We are not able to accommodate foot traffic at this time. Make sure you are all wearing a mask. We will provide you with them if you forget.
- You will enter the parking lot from the west. An attendant will be there to welcome you and help guide you.
- It is likely that a line may form on Edgerton Ave in either direction. Please follow the vehicle in front of you and be mindful of our neighbors' driveways.
- Please wear a mask when you are in front of Pastor Debra. Again, if you don't have a mask, an attendant will be available in the parking lot with disposable masks.
- When you are the vehicle "on deck" to receive Holy Communion from Pastor Debra, please stay one vehicle length back for safety and privacy purposes. You will be coming to her with the driver's side near the church, the car facing east.
- The church will be closed and you will not be able to go into the church while you are coming to receive Holy Communion.
- When you reach Pastor Debra near the walkway that enters into the church,
 Pastor will give you Holy Communion that will already have been consecrated in
 a pre-packaged set and give it to you through the driver's window along with a
 sheet of prayers to use when receiving. Pastor Debra will provide a blessing.
 Pastor will be wearing a mask, as will you, to protect both of you. There will be
 no physical contact.

- After you have received the elements of Holy Communion, please immediately
 exit the parking lot using the east entrance so that you do not cause a back up or
 congestion in the parking lot.
- If you have also brought socks then someone will come to the passenger's side, also masked, as should be any of your passengers, and you can put your socks into the receptacle provided. Again, after you receive Communion, please proceed out of the east exit/entrance to the parking lot so that others can now come into the lot.
- We will be here even if it rains. If there is severe weather forecast we will cancel.

- 2. Trial Annual Meeting: On August 9, 2020 at 11AM will we have a Zoom Annual Meeting trial. Our actually Annual meeting, using Zoom, will be on August 30. (You will need to register for the actual Annual Meeting (and the eventual Call Meeting for your new Pastor.) For this meeting you will simply need to come and in place of fellowship we are going to try out the voting process that you will need to use for the Annual Meeting and to vote for your new Pastor. Everyone already gets an invitation each week to come to virtual Fellowship.
- **3. Update from Call Committee:** The Adoration call committee is continuing on their mission of calling a new pastor. After finalizing their interview questions, they conducted a virtual mock interview with a retired pastor on Wednesday, July 8th and received thoughtful and supportive feedback. The call committee is now extremely confident and is ready to move forward with interviewing actual candidates. Pastor Kristin from the synod will be guiding us with this next step. Thank you for your trust and prayers as they continue to move forward, *From the Call Committee (Sandy Young, Chair; Mardy Lazaris; Jessica Hodgson; Jim Haas; Jennifer Anderson; and Gloria Becker.)*

4. Ministry opportunities--Updates from Jessica Hodgson

A. ERAS (used to be Southwest Interfaith) Mum Sale

ERAS (previously Southwest Interfaith) has continued to provide services to older adults throughout the pandemic. These services help older adults stay independent as long as possible.

Vernon Shelly's family (Note: Vernon Shelly is Crystal Willm's beloved grandfather) is opting to have a large service at the Max Sass funeral home to celebrate his life. I regret that I will not be doing that service for them having been present as he was dying. We have had several other deaths in the parish since the pandemic began and details are not available for those yet.

Please pray for these family's who have not been able to grieve using the fullness of their faith during this pandemic.

8. Notes from Kirk: Hi, Kirk here again. My Mom is very busy this week working on something called a Curbside Communion service. So decided to step in and help her out sending you some thoughts for your all congregation update. My dog-Mom always used to say, "many paws make light work!"

I've had another exciting week. We have several young humans and one of them got to stay with me for three whole days. He is learning not to pull on my ears. But I really like him to be here because he drops lots of food on the floor for me to eat. I think he really likes me!

For a long time I have been doing on two walks every day. Now, sometimes, it's THREE walks because my Moms are both home so much and I think they really, really love me.

Sometimes we walk down to the pond near our house (Ed. note: Riverside Park). I love to see the baby ducks and the heron. (Well, if I am being honest, as Mom has taught me to be, I really like to jump at the baby ducks. The Mama duck does not seem to like that very much and flapped at me. It scared me so now I don't do that anymore.)

But every day, twice a day, we walk around all the houses in our neighborhood and I get to check out all of the mailbox posts for "messages" that my friends might have left me. Sometimes we go down to the pond, but I know the pond and it's smells. I love our pond. I love the sameness of our walks. It makes me feel safe.

This past week, Mom said to me, "Come on, Kirk. Let's go for a ride." Now, I love her and I usually trust her, but sometimes our rides end up at the dog Doctor and I have to get shots and things. I don't like that very much. So, I went very slowly to the car with my ears back and my tail hanging down to let her know that I was not very happy that we weren't going on our regular walk. I got into the car. But I was not happy. After a short drive she stopped the car and I jumped out. We were in a very different place. (Ed. note: Rotary Park.)

There was a big field with dirt and some sort of sacks on it, and grass all around it (Ed. note: a baseball diamond.). I ran from sack to sack and tried to pick them up. Mom yelled at me to "drop it," and so I had to stop. But gosh it was fun! Then we found a river and all sorts of new smells. And there were other dogs that I had never met before walking on the path. I was so excited I almost wiggled out of my fur. It was great!

When we got back in the car to go back home Mom reminded me that not all new things are bad. She said that's how it is with God and us. We sometimes find ourselves in new situations that we did not want to be in and God still makes good come out of those situations if we are open to it. Mom says, "God, who is all good, can work with anything to bring good."

I'm going to try and remember that the next time Mom asks me to do something that is new. Mom loves me like God loves you.
