Dear ones.

This is some information that you all need to know about a variety of things that are going on in the congregation in the next weeks.

- 1. **Budget meeting: Sunday, November 29 at 11AM.** The Council has approved a budget for 2021 that now goes to the congregation for approval. Watch for the Zoom invitation to register and be part of that important meeting in the life of the congregation.
- 2. Stewardship: Stewardship Sunday--November 22, 2020. For the last few weeks you have been receiving Stewardship moment from members of the congregation to remind you of the blessings that Adoration offers members of the congregation and the larger community. You can be so very proud of your church. This week you will receive in the regular mail a letter from this year's Stewardship Committee asking you to prayerfully consider your pledge for 2021. You will also find a copy of a pledge card. You can either bring that with you at the Curbside Communion on November 22--or get it in the mail this week so that it arrives in the church mail by Saturday, November 21.
- **3. Next Curbside Communion: Sunday, November 22, 9AM-10AM**. The next Curbside Communion will be the Sunday after next, November 22. This time we are collecting men's jeans and underwear (boxers or briefs). Larger sizes are much appreciated. The jeans do not have to be new. Just washed. If you are thinking of buying you might consider Goodwill or St. Vincent DePaul. For the homeless community, jeans are a prized commodity. So, if you have an old pair you'd be willing to part with--or you are able to shop somewhere, that would be great! These items will be take to Repairer's of the Breach--the only day program for homeless individuals in Milwaukee county.

- a. Your pledge card for 2021 (that you will receive in the mail this week.)
- b. Your offering for that Sunday.
- c. Men's jeans or underwear.

4. Meru Coffee: HOLIDAY GIFTS?

Mt. Meru Coffee Project Holiday Items:

This year Mt. Meru Coffee Project will again be offering it's Holiday Sampler which include six 2oz packages of their premium coffee. Each sampler will include one package of each of the following flavors: Regular, Peaberry, Chocolate Raspberry, French Vanilla, Hazelnut, and Butter Pecan. Holiday Samplers are selling for \$18.00 if purchased through a partner congregation.

In addition to the Holiday Sampler, Mt. Meru Coffee Project is also offering a special Makumira Farms Holiday Blend. This year's peaberry coffee from the small farms of the Makumira cooperative has been rated higher than most other coffees available globally. This Makumira coffee is blended with other Mt Meru peaberry to balance the flavor and offers a hint chocolate-like flavor. The Makumira Farms Holiday Blend is selling for \$19.00 when purchased through a partner congregation.

As Adoration's Coffee Ambassador to the Mt Meru Coffee Project, I will do my best to have these items available for purchase during our drive-thru communions. Also available for purchase at that time are the other various coffee items that are regularly available year round. If you would like something that I don't normally stock (flavored decaf options, single serve/K-cup boxes, etc.) Please let me know and I can special order these items. 6. ERAS Contactless Volunteer Opportunity:

ERAS will be partnering up with Milwaukee County Department on Aging (MCDA) and Hunger Task Force to help deliver a monthly Stock Box to seniors in Milwaukee County during the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.

A Stock Box is a box of healthy foods that Hunger Task Force delivers to low-income seniors free of charge. Each box contains 16 nutritious items including rice, cereal, juice, beef stew, pasta, and vegetables. Each month, nearly 9,000 boxes are delivered to seniors in Southeastern Wisconsin.

From Pastor Debra, Interim Pastor Grace Needed

You will very soon have a new Pastor. You might be interested to know that all Pastors talk about this day is how to manage a church during a pandemic. Your new Pastor will also be consumed with this issue because they will be trying to enter into your system blind. It's a new reality. It's not a new normal; it is truly a new reality.

And every church, on some level, is struggling with this new reality. All churches have some controversy because not everyone is on the same page regarding the pandemic. None of us Pastor have ever been confronted with the types of controversies we are now expected to manage. We love all of you and so the controversies are challenging.

The following controversial issues are the ones that your new Pastor is going to be facing. They are the ones that I and your Council have been managing or some months now. (Borrowing from the church blogger, Thom Rainer). The list, of course, is not exhaustive nor is it mutually exclusive.

Mask vs. no mask. This one is by far the most common. Members get mad if

masks are required. Members get mad if masks aren't required. Masks or no masks for some members become a sign of political affiliation.

Social distance vs. no social distance. As an extrovert, I have found this a particular challenge. But some members strongly prefer it. And some members really don't like it and just want to be closer "like they always gave been." Yet, if you don't practice social distancing in the church, some members don't like that either.

Change vs. no change. Of course, this debate is not new. But the pace of change has been exacerbated by the pandemic. Some members don't understand why the church can't get back to the way it's always done things. Other members think it's time to move rapidly before the blank slate becomes cluttered.

Same personnel vs. change in personnel. One church discovered during the pandemic it really did not need a full-time receptionist. Relatively few people came in the church facilities pre-COVID, and the number dropped to almost zero from the quarantine to today. The leaders deleted the position. Some members were really mad.

Zoom vs. no Zoom. Just like a number of employees liked the digital opportunity to work from anywhere, so did many church members who connected with other church members through Zoom or some other video technology. This debate is particularly evident in the ministry of small groups. Some want to keep the ministry digital. Others want to meet in person. The Pastor wants two ibuprofen.

Regather vs. don't regather. For many churches, this season of regathering is in its early transitional stage and in our Synod, our Bishop is strongly recommending we do not meet in our buildings because the risk is so high. And as some churches move to go back into their buildings, some members are choosing to remain digital because it feels safer to them. This changes the workload of your Pastor. And in addition, there are now divisions in some churches between the regathered and the digital.

It seems the one area where we need to focus more powerfully is grace. We need to show grace to pastors (you are about to have a new one!) and other church leaders who feel like they are making lose-lose decisions. We need to show grace to members who are not ready to regather. Some of them are elderly. Some of them have young children and are not ready to expose them to crowds. Some have underlying conditions that make them more vulnerable. Some of them have loved ones who are sick or who have died. And the number of people at Adoration who have experienced the full ferocity of this virus, including death among loved ones is rising each week.

Maybe our focus for this season should be more of a focus on grace. After all, we have been shown grace by a Savior who died for us. I think, perhaps, the least we can do is to demonstrate grace and an attitude of humility to those with whom we may have different opinions. Because that's what Jesus would do.
