RETURN TO WORSHIP

Members and Friends of Adoration:

On behalf of the Church Council, I am excited to announce that Adoration has begun weekly, in-person worship, effective June 13, and continuing each Sunday and Wednesday!

The Council, trusting that most of our congregation has been fully vaccinated, has taken into account the recommendations of the Back-in-the-Building Committee (BIB), CDC guidelines, and WI Council of Churches guidelines, and voted to continue enacting the following safety measures.

There is still risk for those without full vaccination, and we continue to encourage caution and safety procedures for all to protect the weak and the vulnerable among us.

Here's what to expect:

Sign-in, but NO sign-up!

We will continue contact tracing by sign-in when arriving to worship. You no longer need to RSVP to attend worship.

Come only if you're healthy!

If you have a fever, cough, or any symptoms associated with COVID-19, please stay home on behalf of you and your neighbor. Continue to practice good hand hygiene and use sanitizer stations located throughout the building.

Every other pew will remain taped-off to ensure a safer distance behind and in front of you.

Limited Contact

We continue to try to limit contact, especially with regards to offerings, communion, and other places with multiple contact points. We encourage other forms of greeting beyond handshaking. We will explore options of having fellowship time outdoors in the coming weeks and months.

Cleaning

After services, we will continue to have clean-up and disinfectant sanitizing of each pew.

If you are unable or not yet comfortable returning to indoor worship, we want to reach you as well. Pastor Matt is happy to arrange a means for you to receive communion, a one -on-one pastoral visit, and to work on faith practices individually with you.

Dear church: trying to discern the proper way and safest way forward is an imperfect and challenging task. Throughout the pandemic, this has been a team effort among our congregational leaders. I am grateful for the work they have done and the wisdom and safety practices they have introduced to us.

The Commemoration of the Emanuel 9 JUNE 17

As part of the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, voting members adopted a resolution designating June 17 as a commemoration of the martyrdom of the Emanuel 9—the nine people shot and killed on June 17, 2015, during a Bible study at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, S.C.

Two of those killed graduated from and were formed in ELCA seminaries. The shooter was raised in the ELCA. Our church's relationship to the shooter, as well as two of the slain, reminds us of both our complicity and our calling. May God continue to guide us as we seek repentance and renewal, and racial justice and reconciliation among God's precious children.

God, our truth, through the ages you have spoken through prophets. Stir up in your church a passion for your word revealed in Jesus, that following the witness of the Emanuel Nine, your church studies the scriptures, shows hospitality, prays without ceasing, and embodies prophetic justice in community. Embolden church leaders and all the baptized to remember the lives of the Nine, repent of racism and white supremacy, and renew our commitment to your word revealed most fully in Jesus, our way, truth, and life. From the Files of Pastor Matt A reflection for our life together as God's people

June-July 2021: Rooted in Faith, Rooted in God

Our home garden recently offered its first produce of the year. A lovely pink radish pushed up from the soil, and later that night, made a delicious and peppery addition to our salad. Because I'm a word nerd, I started thinking about the name radish. Sure enough, it comes from the very same family as the word for root, radix.

Many of our readings this summer are a part of the "green season" of church; they speak in parables and poetry about the way God's relationship to us and our faith are like the natural and automatic process of growth among the plants of the earth. The bible invites us to ponder of a bush from tiny seed blooming into a home for every bird in creation, what God will do with weeds and wheat, the growth of the kingdom of God, and God as gardener, tending to our lives of faith.

One of the kernels of Jesus' preaching and teaching is his proclamation that the gospel and love of God are radical. A radical gospel? A radical church? We might typically assume radical to be negative, applied to extremists, opponents, or ideas we think are just a little too risky.

But Jesus' radical message, while challenging at many turns, has deep rootedness to God's relationship with humanity, and is deeply rooted in God's values, not the world's. Lutheran theologian Jason Mahn notes that Jesus invites his disciples to have "the same root system" as he is proclaiming and teaching and healing in Mark: a root system of "outlandish trust that God has acted decisively through Jesus to unveil a new way of being in the world." [in Radical Lutherans/Lutheran Radicals, (Eugene, OR: Wipf & Stock, 2017), pp. 8-9.]

As we tend to our community, as we notice where the weeds are choking out the roots of our own faith, I hope and pray that God's Holy Spirit will fill Adoration with a rooted, radical courage to notice where God is active in and around us, and where we might find ourselves trusting outlandishly that God's abundant grace will not only keep us rooted, but also bearing fruit.
