Pastor Matt's Musings

In this season where we celebrate Christ's presence in our human form, and in this season where we share love through the giving of plenty of Christmas presents, I have an honest confession to make. It's hard for me to live in the present moment.

Not just as a pastor. But as a flesh-and-blood human. Being in the present; staying still in the moment; listening and noticing what is happening here and now. All of these do not come naturally to me. If you resemble these remarks, "Fear Not!"

Luke, our gospel storyteller in this season of stories about God's birth in our flesh—seems to understand this is a part of our shared experience of being human. Time and again, from the messenger Gabriel's visitation to Mary, to Simeon and Anna's joy, to Jesus' baptism and his Holy Spirit flung sojourn into the wilderness, Luke's stories are filled with reminders that these are not just historical memories or ancient lore.

The word NOW shows up all over Luke's gospel—as if Luke's trying to crack through our nostalgia and our future fear and remind us to be present and notice the healing and salvation of our God are NOW already present all around us. Now! The feast and celebration begin. This IS the feast of victory for our God. Now your servant can rest in peace. Today you will be with me in paradise.

Even if we can't be fully present, we believe God's presence in the gift of Christ's birth already has an impact and is, as his mother sings, "turning the world right-side-up again." Now. And forever more.

As we, dear church, enter this Christmas season, may we rest in the stillness, the presence, and the good news that Christ is born today. In this moment. May your seasons be filled with the signs of hope and promise that are here given for us and for *all*. Let us delight in Mary and Joseph, and the holy child Jesus in the manger.

"WRAPPED IN LOVE" Ministry Blessed

On December 12th, we commissioned and blessed 'Wrapped in Love,' a ministry begun before the pandemic at Adoration focused on hand-crafting wraps and shawls to be shared with those (inside and outside our congregation) in need of a tangible sign of God's presence and love. Wendy Haas shares a few insights into this ministry and how you might share a 'Wrapped in Love' item with someone you care for.

What is a prayer wrap?

It is a wearable hug crafted with love and prayers from maker to recipient.

It can be knitted, crocheted, woven or crafted with cloth in another way.

All wraps have a prayer card pinned to them, for the person receiving it.

We welcome and encourage anyone to make these wraps.

When might a Prayer Wrap be shared with someone?

Going through multiple medical procedures During prolonged illness and recovery As a comfort after loss or in grief Someone going through stressful times

How do you give someone a Prayer Wrap?

Select your wrap paying attention to the size. Some wraps are smaller and some larger.

Make sure there is a prayer card attached to it.

Take it and give it to the person in need. If there are no wraps, please be patient.

We are working on them! These wraps are handmade and take time.

If you are considering giving a congregation member a wrap, it would be kind to communicate to others, so that person receives only one.

Would you like to start a new Epiphany Tradition? Celebrate a *House Blessing*



Matthew writes that when the magi saw the shining star stop overhead, they were filled with joy. "On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother" (Matt. 2:10-11). In the home, Christ is met in family and friends, in visitors and strangers. In the home, faith is shared, nurtured, and put into action. In the home, Christ is welcome. The Church has a custom of blessing homes on the Feast of the Epiphany and the week following. Family and friends gather to ask God's blessing on their homes and those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows.

During the time after Epiphany Pastor Matt would love to gather with you and celebrate the blessing of your home. Following an eastern European tradition, a visual blessing may be inscribed with white chalk above the main door; for example, 20 + CMB + 22. The numbers change with each new year. The three letters stand for either the ancient Latin blessing Christe mansionem benedicat, which means "Christ, bless this house," or the legendary names of the magi (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar).

Your End-of-Year Gifts to Adoration

May Have Added Tax Benefits in 2021!

The CARES ACT, passed by Congress in 2020, extended many charitable giving tax incentives. As you consider end-of-year offerings, note these one-time benefits.

Higher Deduction Limits: Extended for 2021, a provision allows individuals to deduct cash contributions made to qualified charitable organizations of up to 100% of their adjusted gross income (AGI). The limit was 60% prior to the CARES Act.

Extended \$300 Charitable Deduction for Non-Itemizers: Also extended is a provision that enables taxpayers who take the standard deduction to claim an above-the-line tax deduction for a total of \$300 in qualified cash donations on their tax return. This means that taxpayers, including married individuals filing separate returns, can claim a

deduction of up to \$300 for cash contributions to qualifying charities during 2021. The maximum deduction is \$600 for married individuals filing joint returns.

We have already received many generous pledges and increases in giving for 2022! There's still time to help us end the year in a strong financial position!

Thank you for your support of Adoration's mission and ministry, and for giving us the flexibility and freedom to dream big as we imagine the future of our outreach to the community as a place of sacred story and sacred rest.



A Few Covid-19 Reminders from the Back-in-the-Building Committee

As we enter the Christmas Season, Adoration continues to practice care and caution amidst COVID.
