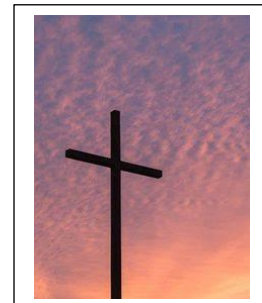
Dear Members of the Worship and Music Committee,
