Meal Train - If you would like to prepare a meal that can easily be reheated, or quickly prepared, please consider doing so. Meals can be dropped off at the church and put in the freezer or refrigerator or reach out to Justin/Natasha to drop off at their house.

*Please include a note from who made it, what it is and any special instructions to reheat/prepare it.

**Justin and Natasha are adhering to a low-fat, low-carb diet as much as possible, so kindly whip something up that fits that profile!

***Feel free to make something separate for their kiddos...let's face it, they like the good stuff!

Ex: burgers, chicken tenders, pizza, mac & cheese, etc.

Stock the Sneesby Pantry - We have dedicated a spot in the back of church where people can place shelf-stable items. The kids will be home for summer vacation soon, so keep in mind go-to, easy snacks when shopping.

Ex: canned fruit and veggies, soup, pasta, mac & cheese, peanut butter, jelly, Nutella, applesauce, granola bars, fruit bars, fruit snacks, juice boxes, etc.

To Our Adoration Family,

First off, I would like to say thank you from the bottom of my heart. I am incredibly humbled by your generosity to our family and the well wishes and prayers for my health. I wish I could tell you more about what is happening to me. Regarding my health, I have been trying to ask for tests and see specialists earlier. However, I have not been able to accomplish this. I am still dealing with many symptoms and issues, from dizziness, unsteadiness on my feet, weakness, fatigue, and cognitive issues. So, overall, there have been no changes to day to day with me. I am feeling frustrated and, overall, desperate for answers. Trust me, Natasha has asked and searched the ends of the internet and medical journals for answers, but we have not found answers, only more questions. In these times, the only thing I can trust is God and His purpose for all of this, and that is what I am trying to do. Overall, I want to let you all know how appreciative I am of all of you. I want to let you all know that because I don't think you all know how much you all mean to us and our family. It really shows how much Adoration is like a family. We can bicker and have little fights here and there, but when someone is in need, we all pull together and give and pull together and roll up our sleeves to help them. Natasha, the kids, and I are truly appreciative and ever in debt to your outpouring of love, which really shows the love of Christ.
