

ALERT REGARDING SCAM AFFECTING ADORATION LUTHERAN CHURCH

#1 It has been brought to our attention that scammers are texting members of our church, as though it is coming from the Pastor, asking for gift cards. The message mentions the Pastor being in a meeting and unable to purchase gift cards himself and promises to reimburse the person buying them on his behalf.

*DO NOT PURCHASE ANY GIFT CARDS, WITHDRAWAL MONEY FROM YOUR CHECKING OR SAVINGS ACCOUNTS OR AN ATM, PURCHASE MONEY ORDERS, CASHIER'S CHECKS, LOTTERY TICKETS, GOODS OR SERVICES, ETC. DO NOT GIVE OUT ANY SENSITIVE INFORMATION EITHER SUCH AS YOUR DATE OF BIRTH, SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER, CHECKING AND SAVINGS ACCOUNT NUMBERS, CREDIT AND DEBIT CARD NUMBERS, ETC.

#2 It has been brought to our attention that scammers are now trying to call some of our members from a number that appears to be Pastor Dean's cell phone (his cell number is a 414-area code and ends in 3326). It may show as a missed call on your end - even though he did not actually call you.

THIS IS ALSO A SCAM! IF YOU QUESTION WHETHER HE MEANT TO CALL YOU, THEN PLEASE CALL HIM DIRECTLY ON HIS CELL PHONE AND BE SURE TO SPEAK WITH HIM TO VERIFY HIS IDENTITY AND THE REASON FOR HIS CALL TO YOU. YOU MAY ALSO CALL CRYSTAL IN THE CHURCH OFFICE TO ASSIST YOU. PLEASE EXERCISE CAUTION AS SCAMMERS MAY TRY TO IMPERSONATE HIM.

Adoration Wednesday Bible Study - The Chosen - Season 4 - Starting January 22, 2025 at 9:30 a.m.

TENTATIVE SCHEDULE DATES - Dates may change due to holidays.

We will be watching the video series "The Chosen" Season 4 for our Bible Study sessions starting in January 22, 2025. We will meet at our regularly scheduled time from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. We will start the session in-person and on Zoom, watch the video in-person at Adoration, followed by a discussion in-person and on Zoom. We will have the Zoom link open but muted during the showing of the video. For those of you at home – please watch the video on your own – see links below.

The Chosen - Season 4

<u>Episode 1:</u> "Promises" (56 minutes) **Wed. January 22 –** <u>Luke 1:39-45 and Isaiah 62:1-12.</u> (An intoxicating dance leads Herod to put an end to John the Baptizer, but no one can stop what- or Who- he's ushered in.)

Episode 2: "Confessions" (1 hour 20 minutes) Wed. January 29 — Mathew 18:15-20. (Jesus founds his church on unholy ground and Simon goes public with Jesus' true identity, getting a new name in the process. But can the new "Peter" forgive old wrongs?)

Episode 3: "Moon to Blood" (57 minutes) Wed. February 5 – 2 Samuel 12:15-23. (Religious leaders confront Jesus after he heals a blind man on the Sabbath, sparking chaos. Gaius defies orders, leading Quintus to take a life into his own hands.)

<u>Episode 4:</u> "Calm Before" (1 hour 5 minutes) **Wed. February 12** – <u>Matthew 8:5-13, Mark 10:35-45, and Matthew 15:13-20.</u> (Funeral procession marks the start of Jesus' final ministry days. His disciples crave prominence, while a Roman leader approaches with a modest plea.)

Episode 5: "Sitting, Serving, Scheming" (1 hour 7 minutes) Wed. February 19 – Matthew 5:38-42, Luke 10:38-42 and Matthew 20:1-16. (Roman soldiers force disciples to carry gear, but Jesus raises the bar. Disgruntled over ministry's path, Judas seeks counsel from a former associate.)

<u>Episode 6:</u> "Dedication" (1 hour 4 minutes) <u>Wed. February 26 – John 10</u>. (During Hanukkah celebrations, Matthew confronts Judas about suspicious activities. A violent clash erupts, forcing the disciples to flee. Though they escape, they learn of a friend's tragic fate.)

<u>Episode 7:</u> "The Last Sign" (1 hour 13 minutes) **Wed. March 5 - ASH WEDNESDAY** [Tentative Alternate Date – March 12] – <u>John 11:21, 23, 25, and 35</u> (Jesus performs a miracle, raising Lazarus from the dead, igniting events culminating in his own crucifixion and resurrection.)

Episode 8: "Humble" (1 hour 18 minutes) Wed. March 12 – [Tentative Alternate Date – March 19] – Exodus 12:1-28 and 13:3-16, 1 Chronicles 3:1, John 12:13, Matthew 26:6-12, John 11:45-57, John 12:1-8, Matthew 25:31-46, and Matthew 21:1-7. (Jesus refuses to look and act like the Messiah everyone expects-arriving like a lamb instead of a lion and riding a donkey instead of a war horse.)
